





Our Home






We live in a one-story house in North Carolina with three bedrooms and two bathrooms, which was built in the 1960s. We chose this house because the dining room in the back has lots of windows which let light in, and bring a view of the backyard into the house. We renovated the kitchen ourselves and Matt made the kitchen countertops and cabinets himself. We've done a lot of DIY work in the backyard too, building a chicken coop and a playhouse and putting in pathways and growing grass. We really enjoy our backyard and when the mosquitoes aren't trying to eat us alive, we spend a lot of time out there. In the spring and fall we often eat dinner outside on the deck. Our girls like playing with the hose, plastic baby pool, or other water toys, or playing with sand on a sand table. One of our favorite recurring moments in the home is when we are in the living room sitting on the couch during the kids' nap time. 
EDUCATION

We are just starting homeschooling with our girls. 












Thank You!
