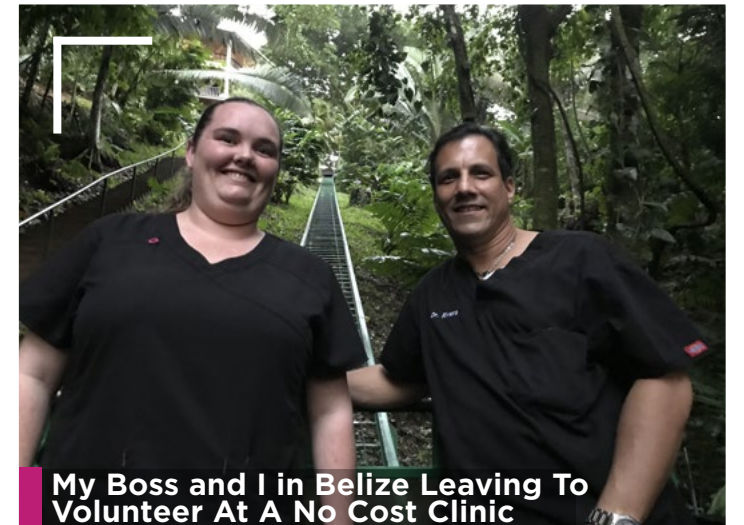

Outside of the normal work day, I am inspired to continue making an impact for both animals and those who care for them through giving back. I have spent time volunteering at a spay and neuter clinic in Belize, where I assisted with basic care and helped improve access to essential veterinary services for underserved communities. Locally, I created an “Angel Tree” initiative during the holidays to collect supplies, such as food, toys, and other essential items for animals in need. In addition, I sometimes foster animals (in 2026, a mother dog and her five one-week-old puppies).

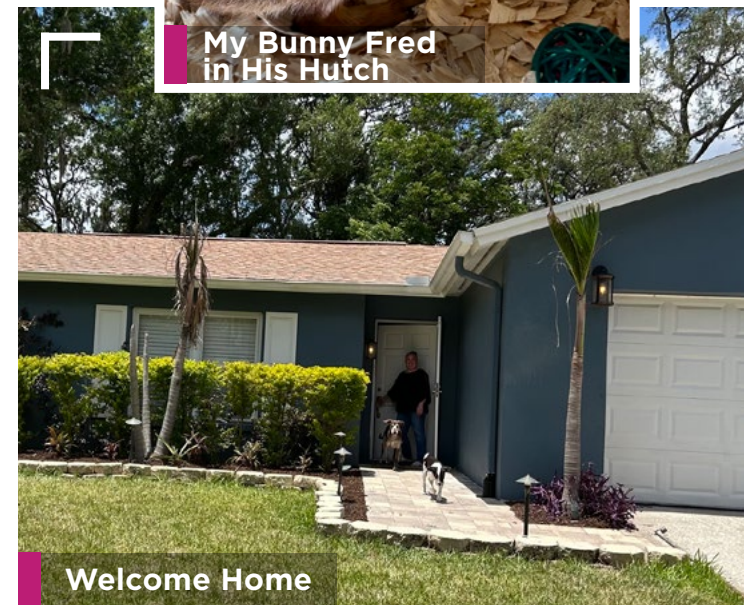

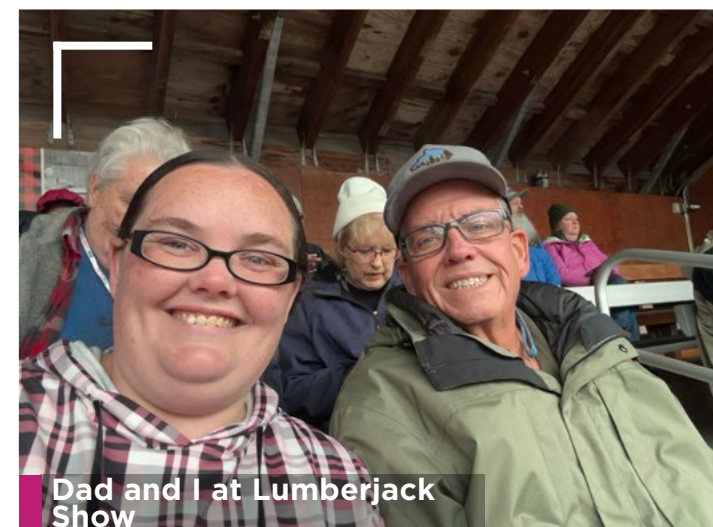
